Presentation Details:

“Environmental approach to support the Browse FLNG Development: 20 years of scientific studies”

Browse FLNG Development is a major gas development in Australia's northwest, 425 km north of Broome. It consists of three large gas reservoirs, Brentnock, Calliance and Torosa with a combined total of 14.9 trillion cubic feet of day gas and 400 million barrels of condensate. A significant portion of the Torosa field is located beneath Scott Reef, a large offshore coral reef covering over 600 km². In the last 20 years, Woodside as operator of the Browse LNG Development has undertaken numerous environment studies to understand the biodiversity and ecosystem function of Scott Reef. This presentation will outline the outcomes of these environmental studies and the business drivers behind them.

The Presenter: Luke Smith is Chief Environment Scientist at Woodside Energy, where he manages a team responsible for the environmental science and impact assessments that support Woodside's current and future business needs. He has worked on numerous major O&G developments both in Australia and internationally. He has over 20 years experience in undertaking and managing large marine research programs which focus on understanding of O&G-based environmental science and management. He has authored two books and more than 30 peer-reviewed science articles and holds an Adjunct Professorship at University of Western Australia's Ocean Institute.
